RANGER ROUNDUP IN THE WILD, WILD, WEST

The third reunion of the LRRP/Rangers of the First Cavalry Division was held in Killeen, Texas and the mission was a complete success. Unlike the missions of the late sixties and early seventies this mission involved a much larger team, better rations and sleeping arrangements, improved communications and considerably less danger. Like fine wine, the U.S. Army just gets better and better with the passage of time.

Team leader, Mike Echterling, provided the following intel at the debriefing. This material has been declassified and can be reviewed by any interested parties regardless of security clearances.

Terrain-Flat, hot, no canopy, several oasis-like areas though, that offered excellent cover for observation/listening posts.

Operations-Significant Activities-No signs of enemy activity to report. Many friendlies sighted, however. Team set up day day position at man-made facility in AO and monitored indigenous personnel in ten-gallon hats, strange leg coverings, and pointed-toed boots engaged in wild, and at times, violent activities with bovine and equine species known as rodeo. Team members unanimously opted to stay with jungle-rules volleyball rather than adopt this sport as a way to pass time between missions!

Night Halts-All team members maintained the watch until very late each evening-most unusual for LRRP/Rangers. No one seemed to want to go to sleep.

Observations and Conclusions—The larger than normal special team of LRRP/Rangers performed magnificently. The mission, a joyous reunion of the men of the best recon unit of the Vietnam War, was accomplished. It appears that the larger the team, the better.

Recommendations-All team members volunteer, and engage in locating and recruiting efforts to attract more team members, for our next mission in Columbus, Georgia-August 9-12, 1990.
