He contacted me through the web site and said that he had some pictures that he had purchased from a dealer of one of our men, Ron Baker. He said that he had not seen anything on the web site about Ron Baker and asked if I would be interested in seeing the pictures. When I checked the roster, I realized that we did not have a Ron Baker on our Roster. WE DO NOW! As it turned out, Mr. Jones' photos were authentic, and we have ten of the photos on our web site. Almost all of the men in the photos have been identified. Mr. Jones even went back to the dealer and got a copy of Ron Baker's Recondo certificate, which is also on the web site now. It's really interesting how we were able to identify one of our own through the web page and a helpful British ally.
