ORLANDO MISSION SUCCESSFUL

The reunion in July was outstanding-nothing less! The fortysix LRRP/RANGERS and their families were a mixture of '87 reunion returnees and first-time reunion attendees. As a returnee I can tell you it was great to see those people who attended last year's reunion again and to meet those who "came home" for the first time in Orlando.

In addition to the offically scheduled reunion activities there was an infinite variety of things to do in Orlando. LRRP/RANGERS and their families reconned Disney World, EPCOT, Boardwalk & Baseball, Cypress Gardens, the Kennedy Space Center, and other points of interest in the area.

OFFICIAL BUSINESS

It goes without saying that our first two reunions would never have occurred without the tireless efforts of Bonnie and Mike Echterling. Mike and Bonnie have tracked down LRRP/RANGERS at an amazing rate, but not without cost. At the present time approximately 350 veterans have been located and there are even more that that yet to be found.
